MLK50 Bell Toll

While many people will be gathering in Memphis, Tennessee today,

Wednesday April 4, to reflect on the solemn anniversary of the assassination of Martin Luther King Jr. 50 years ago, we too can recognize this seminal anniversary connecting the past to the present.

Trinity has responded to the invitation to join churches around the country and the world to toll our bells 39 times to honor the number of years Dr. King lived among us. With each ring we hope to be reminded of his powerful legacy as well as the work of reconciliation and justice still needing to be done. This is a simple, yet meaningful way for us and our nation to acknowledge the loss but more importantly the great contributions Dr. King gave to the world stage.

Since the news rippled across the country, the bells will first ring at the National Civil Rights Museum at 6:01 p.m. CST. Bells will chime in the City of Memphis at 6:03 p.m. CST, 6:05 p.m. CST nationally and 6:07 p.m. CST internationally.

Wherever you are this evening, and especially if you are near Trinity, roll down your window or step outside at **7:05pm** EST and listen for the tolling of the bells, and then may we together recommit ourselves to doing the work of living into the Dream still waiting to come true!

Treasurer's Update: February 2018

Income:

Church actual income is \$72,509.

Compared to budget, church income is \$8,864 (less) than budget.

32% is from pledge payments

The balance is from investments, building use, etc.

Expense:

Church actual expenses are \$101,472.

Compared to budget, church expenses are \$6,371 (less) than budget.

Buildings and Grounds are \$3,992 (less) than budget -

All other categories combined (Personnel, Finance, Parking, Outreach, Worship, Evangelism,

Formation and Pastoral Care) are \$2,379 (less) than budget.

Bottom Line:

YTD, the church has an actual operating loss of \$28,963. We began the year with a positive \$32,615.03 cash balance.

Outlook:

The 2018 budget for the Church expenses is \$649,949.

The outlook is for a balanced budget, because of the cash carry forward.
