Building Repair Updates

- 3. The gas stove in My Brother's Place has finally received the necessary repairs!

Church actual expenses are \$169,590.

Compared to budget, church expenses are \$7,607 (more) than budget.

Buildings and Grounds are \$6,570 (more) than budget -

All other categories combined (Personnel, Finance, Parking, Outreach, Worship, Evangelism,

Formation and Pastoral Care) are \$1,036 (more) than budget.

Bottom Line:

YTD, the church has an actual operating loss of \$51,639.

We began the year with a positive \$32,615.03 cash balance.

Outlook:

The 2018 budget for the Church expenses is \$649,949.
