Building Futures Task Force Report Discussions

Sunday July 8th, 11:15am, My Brother's Place In early 2017 The Building Future's Task Force (BFTF) was formed by the vestry to "assimilate parishioners' perspectives and the expressed vision of the parish, input from our nearby neighbors, input from our

ministry partners, obligations on Trinity as a matter of agreement or law, and technical assessments of our structure." The BFTF did not take the place of, or have the responsibilities of Trinity's Building and Grounds Committee. The BFTF was charged by the vestry to help Trinity develop a plan for how its building can best serve the mission of the parish in the future.

To accomplish this, the BFTF was responsible for providing a "*written recommendation for a planned reinvestment in Trinity's facilities to be made over the next 3-4 years.*"

Lobby/Plaza/"Fishbowl" Construction

Work has begun on the plaza/lobby construction project! Most work currently is being done up on the plaza level. Pullman is deconstructing the problem areas where water caused seepage into the main building. They have exposed the current drainage system and will be repairing it. They are also reinforcing the spaces from below and will continue to be working on the internal structural system of beams. From inside the church there has been little disruption but Pullman is definitely busy at work on other levels. Work is progressing well in these beginning stages.

Director of Music & the Arts Announcement




Thank You Coffee Hour - Josh Wang Sunday July 29th
