After service on Sunday July 29th we held our final conversation about the worship schedule changes that were started on a trial basis in Lent. During this evaluation process we have had three all parish meetings led by Lisa around the components of Sunday morning(9am Breakfast/Choir, 10am Worship & 11:15am Coffee & Conversation). We had a congregational survey about people's experience of the schedule which was completed by 56 individuals and contained 146 comments. Lisa has reported and met with Vestry five times, held guild head meetings for feedback, in addition to many one on one conversations. Commentary was varied and mostly positive as we lived into the experience with some consistent narratives emerging.

-Two opportunities for fellowship(9am Breakfast & 11:15am Coffee) were valued by most. We will continue to work on supporting these two ministries with more organized supplies and setup, more consistent food offerings and expand the number of hosts for both time slots. Stay tuned as we work on specifics as the summer continues.

-One service time is newcomer friendly. We want all to feel welcome walking through our doors and a consistent worship time of 10am is very helpful.

-The Healing Prayer Station is a welcome addition in the back of the sanctuary. We thank Joan & Janice for their ministry in this area. Some additions to this area were discussed along with the language we use to communicate the purpose of the area.

-We are working on the sound system issues, new speakers and technology are coming! -There will continue to be only one worship service at 10am. We need to continue to build community and learn more about our Episcopal traditions together. If a second service is added in the future it will likely be on a different day or in the evening.

-Choir practice will return to Thursday.

-The music and liturgy will continue to evolve. They will reflect the Trinity community living into "Progressive, Inclusive, Creative & Downtown".

-11:30am Formation time will be more consistent/structured going forward. The Christian Formation team will be presenting more in the coming weeks. We will be working in the framework of Presiding Bishop Michael Curry's <u>"Reclaiming Jesus"</u> as we approach the new Formation year. We will also

have times for play and connection during this time slot.

Lisa, the Vestry, and others in leadership thank all who were willing to offer their feedback, have tough conversations and to be willing to approach this schedule change with a generous and open heart. Trinity Leadership will continue to listen to feedback and move forward with many of the excellent ideas provided in the last four months of evaluation with your help. We are learning from each other, growing together in community, and living the embodiment of God's love for each other. You are all welcome and wanted here.

Serving as a Diocesan Convention Delegate

The Episcopal Diocese of Ohio holds an annual Diocesan Convention every November. This Convention is the representative governing body of the diocese, comprised of all clergy and up to three adult lay delegates from every parish. Have you ever wanted to participate in the Episcopal church beyond our local church level? Read on!



The role of a Convention delegate begins with their election by the vestry. Delegates should make an effort to follow diocesan news and to learn about ministries, activities and issues in other congregations. In the weeks before convention, they should carefully read the convention handbook that will be emailed to them. It includes proposed resolutions and budget information as well as biographical information about nominees. After convention, delegates are expected to briefly report back to the Trinity community on the actions taken, as well as the spirit and message of the gathering. This reporting back is critical to representative and transparent governance, and it helps strengthen the community and mission we share as the Episcopal branch of the Jesus Movement in northern Ohio.

This year's convention will be held in in Cleveland on Friday evening, Nov. 9 and Saturday, Nov. 10.
