TRINITY MINISTRY PARTNERS

Statistics on Young Adults aging out of Foster Care
(from the National Foster Youth Institute)

- Only 1 out of every 2 foster kids who age out of the system will have some form of gainful employment by age 24
- There is less than a 3% chance for children who have aged out of foster care to earn a college degree at any point in their life
- After reaching the age of 18, 20% of the children who were in foster care will become instantly homeless
- 7 out of 10 girls who age out of the foster care system will become pregnant before the age of 21

Open Table Toledo

One of Trinity's newest ministries, Open Table Toledo, officially gets underway this spring. The mission of OT is unlike anything else in our community. We exist to offer long-term, consistent, supportive relationships to youth who age out of Lucas County's foster care system.

These 18+-year-old young adults are among the most invisible and at-risk people in our community.

Removed from their families for their own safety and placed into foster care, they reach "official" adulthood without being safely reunited with family or being adopted. They're alone, adrift in a very big world.

And that's where OT comes in. We organize small groups of 6-8 volunteers. They commit to meeting weekly with one young foster alum, giving encouragement and support to that person as they define and work toward goals that yield a flourishing, sustainable life

We aim to change lives one week at a time. (PS: Your life will transform, too.)

Actors Collaborative Toledo in association with The Valentine Theatre present *The Velocity of Autumn* by Eric Coble to benefit Jewish Family Service of Toledo. The stage reading, directed by Jeffrey Albright, will be performed March 16 and 17. Each performance will be followed by a meet and greet and Q&A session with Levinson and Causman.

The Velocity of Autumn swirls around Alexandra, an 80-year-old artist in a showdown with her family over where she'll spend her remaining years. In Alexandra's corner are her wit, her volcanic passion, and the fact that she's barricaded herself in her Brooklyn brownstone with enough Molotov cocktails to take out the block. But her children have their own secret weapon: estranged son Chris, who returns after 20 years, crawls through Alexandra's second-floor window and becomes the family's unlikely mediator. No sooner are the words "Hi, Mom" uttered than the emotional bombs start detonating. *The Velocity of Autumn* is a wickedly funny and wonderfully touching discovery of the fragility and ferocity of life.

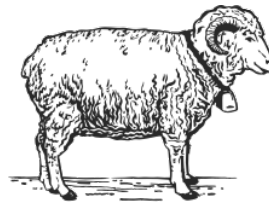
