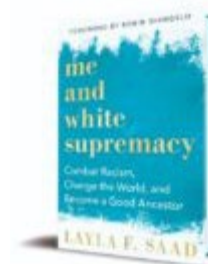
Bell Tolling for COVID Victims

A Message from the Bishop Regarding COVID-19

November 19, 2020

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ, I write you with concern about the ever-increasing spread of COVID-19 and to suggest a few things we can do in response.

Almost every day, I receive reports of clergy, lay leaders, communicants in our diocese, and friends who have tested positive for this virus, are suffering from the symptoms of COVID-19, or, tragically, have died. Very likely, you are experiencing the same. This surge has exceeded the predictions of epidemiologists and physicians in its unbridled spread. It is reported that three million Americans have active coronavirus infections and are potentially contagious, whether symptomatic or not. Some of those are healthcare workers who have put themselves at risk to care for other COVID-19 victims. Their willingness to jeopardize their own health for the care and wellbeing of others is inspiring...[\[continue reading\]](#).

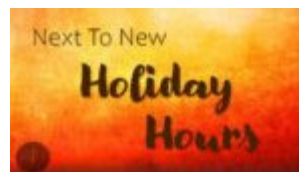
