of the Jesus movement.” Next gathering is July 5th!! All are welcome and wanted!

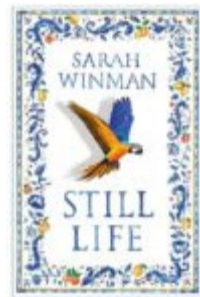
Men’s Bible Study
